



History of CSRDA–SSJDA

CSRDA aims to take a leading role in the development of empirical social science research in Japan through the building of a network of social surveys and data archives.





Collecting Data



What kind of data?

Quantitative data from social surveys for sociology, economics, politics, and education in Japan.

Depositors

- Researchers
 - Institutes associated with universities
 - Private research institutions
 - Government agencies
- Etc.

Data Collection Policy

- We accept survey data from researchers, government agencies, labor unions, commercial firms with research divisions, etc.
 - Most of the datasets that we receive are based on probability sampling.
 - We accept non-probability data (e.g., quota sampling and internet surveys) if such datasets have research value.
 - We do not curate aggregate data, qualitative data, or non-numeric data.

Curating Data



What the SSJDA staff does

- Manage depositor's personal information
- Maintain confidentiality
- Make the data suitable for public use
- Prepare metadata/data documentation
- Translate metadata, data labels, and survey forms from Japanese to English

Summary	<p>Along with changes in the labor market structure, the drastic decline in the birthrate, the growing proportion of elderly people social attitudes, and lifestyle in Japanese society are about to undergo a substantial change. When considering the future directions are currently occurring, or where these changes are occurring.</p> <p>The panel research project of the Institute of Social Science of the University of Tokyo uses a panel (follow-up) survey method. The University of Tokyo is implementing three panel surveys, as a nationwide survey on changes in working style and lifestyle (JLPS-Y), a middle-aged panel (JLPS-M), a panel of high school graduates (JLPS-H).</p> <p>JLPS-Y and JLPS-M, which started in January 2007, include comprehensive questionnaire items on topics such as occupation, income, and the few large panel surveys in Japan. Items related to occupation are also very detailed, and items in compliance with the national standards.</p> <p>JLPS-Y covers the so-called "young generation" from 20 to 34 years old as of the end of December 2006, and JLPS-M covers the middle-aged generation from 35 to 54 years old as of the end of December 2006, and JLPS-H covers the high school graduates from 1980 to 1989 as of the end of December 2006.</p>



Sharing Data



Qualifications for Data Use

- Researchers affiliated with academic institutions (universities, colleges, and research institutions) and graduate students.
- Applications from researchers in private-sector research organizations are only accepted from researchers in organizations that have deposited data with SSJDA.


Condition of use: Some excerpts

- Academic use only
- Some data, however, can be used for educational purposes
- Registration and usage fees are not required.
- The period of use of the permitted data is basically one year. If you want to use it further, you need to apply for an extension.
- Data that have expired must be deleted.
- When publishing the results of the secondary analysis of SSJDA dataset(s), users should state the name of the study and the depositor of the data. They must also state that these data were provided by SSJDA and that they have used these data to write their paper.

- * Because the expiration date for undergraduate students is on 31 March (this month), applications submitted by undergraduate students in this March will be approved from next month.
- * For undergraduate students, the period of use terminates on March 31 of the academic year for which the application is submitted. (2014/10/1)
- * Permission to download is valid for 30 days after the day such permission is granted. To download data after this date, please re-apply for permission to download.
- * When using the data for educational purposes, the data usage period is one year.



Abstract
The Japanese General Social Surveys (JGSS) Project is a Japanese version of the General Social Survey (GSS) project closely replicating the original GSS of NORC, University of Chicago. It provides data for analyses of Japanese society, attitudes, and behaviors, which makes possible international comparisons.
The objectives of the JGSS project are three-fold: (1) to collect and build cumulative data on general social surveys in Japan in a regular and consistent manner; thus enabling a time-series analysis; (2) to provide data for secondary analyses to researchers and university students in various social science fields; and, (3) to provide data in a format useful for international comparative studies, research and reports.



Ongoing Data Infrastructure Projects

■ Strengthening the System

- Renovate SSJDA-Direct
- Implement self-deposit system (registration; updating personal information and general information about the data), staff performs data curation
- Collaborate on the construction of a comprehensive Data Catalog which is promoted by JSPS

■ Developing a new online analysis system

- In view of the fact that the development of Nesstar has stopped. We are planning to start providing a new online data analysis system, which we are developing ourselves, by 2022.

■ Promoting internationalization

- Translation of metadata and major datasets
- Applying for the CoreTrustSeal (CTS)
- Deepen relationships with overseas data archives
