





# What?

• **Stakeholder engagement** is the process by which organisations communicate and get to know their stakeholders. By getting to know them, organisations are able to better understand what they want, when they want it, how engaged they are and how the organization's plans and actions will affect their goals. Furthermore, they can improve their communication and rethinking their strategies and operations, having long-term benefits such as brand reputation or first mover advantage.



# Why?

- Gain stakeholder approval and support
- Minimise opposition and satisfy their needs as far as possible
- Anticipate what risks and opportunities might arise
- Enable plans to be laid and managed



## 10 key principles of stakeholder engagement

- 1. Communicate
- 2. Consult, early and often
- 3. Remember, they're only human
- 4. Plan it!
- 5. Relationships are key



- 6. Simple, but not easy
- 7. Just part of managing risk
- 8. Compromise
- 9. Understand what success is
- 10. Take responsibility






