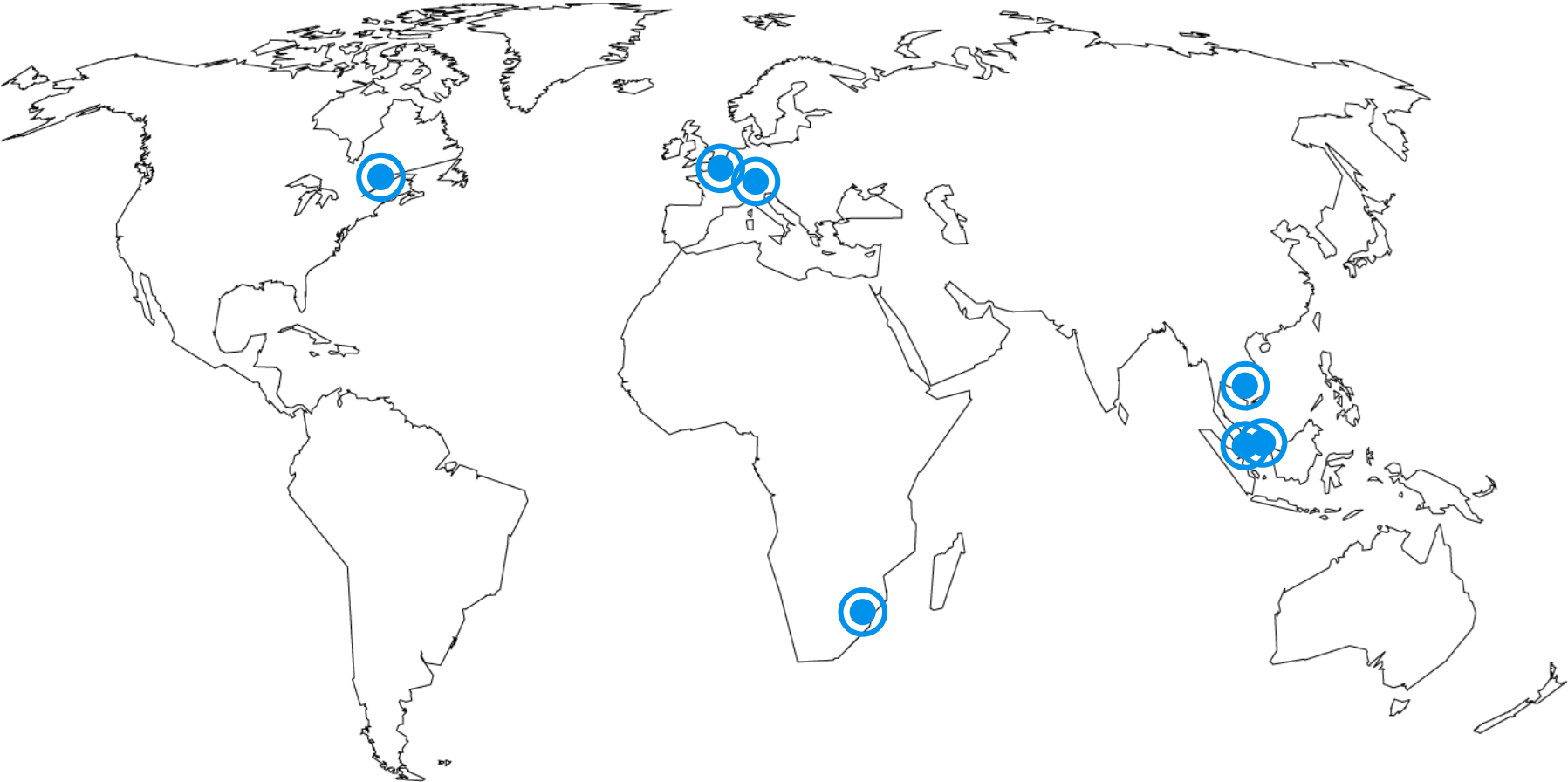

- Provide practical guidance, advice, and support to Cambodian library leaders



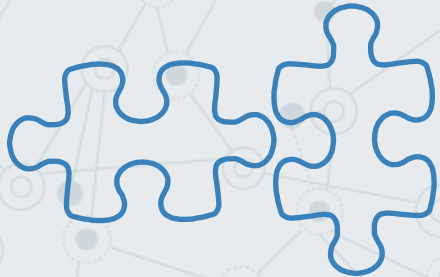
- Build networks and a community of practice

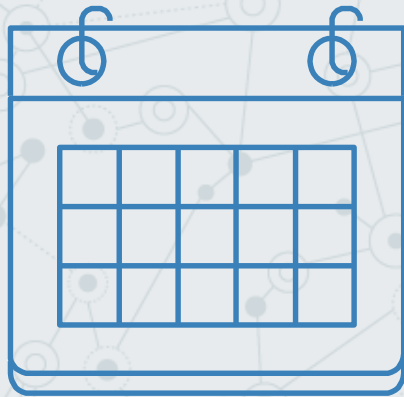

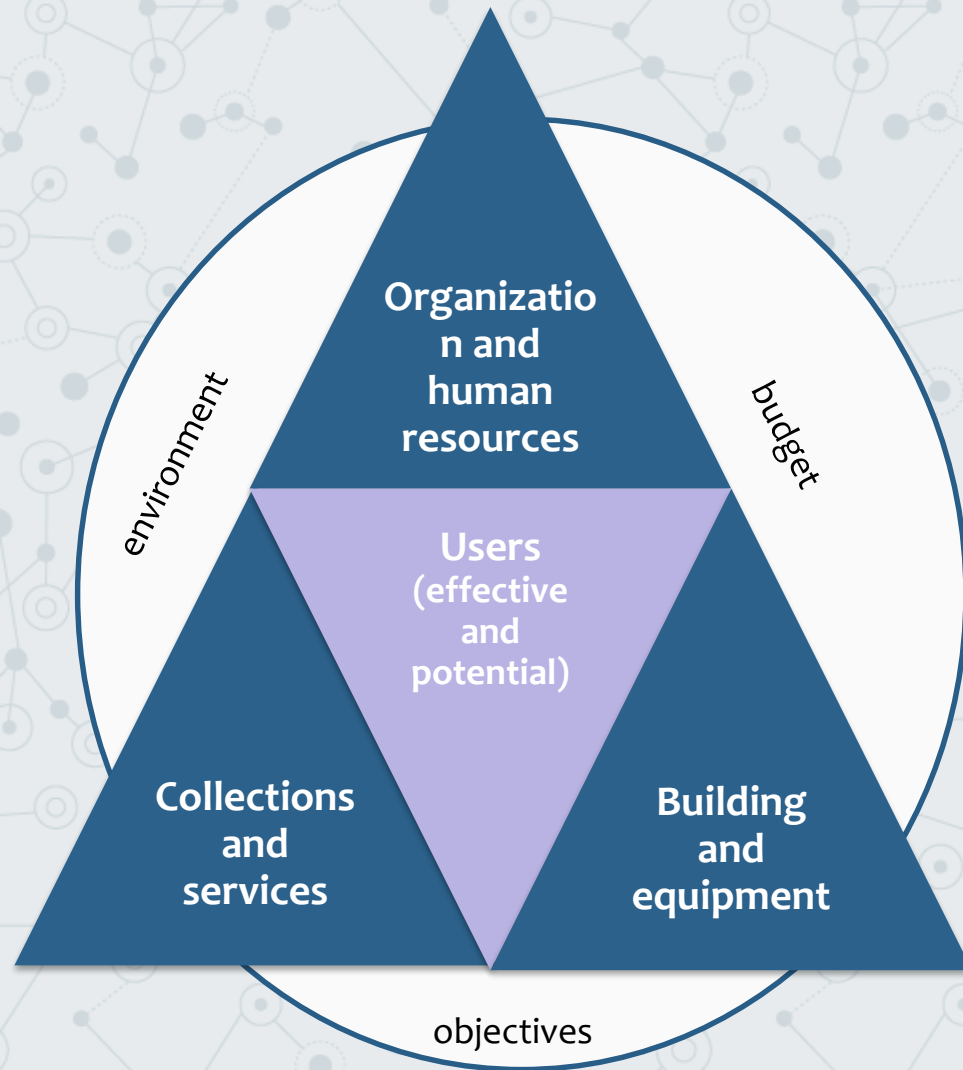
