Please make sure that all citations attributed to you are indeed from papers where **you** are an author or co-author. Similarly, please make sure that these citation services are not omitting any of your publications.

Once you work with the SMU Research Librarian to do this checking and cleaning up of your citations, your record within these citation database will be easy to verify and maintain going forward.






