

What did the academic libraries in Singapore do?




Repositori Institusi

- ❑ Poin-poin yang akan dipaparkan antara lain sekilas mengenai universitas yang ada di Singapura, perkembangan repositori institusi, kebijakan institusi dan koleksi khusus.


- 2005 : NIE repository – mostly for internal use

- 2010 : NUS ScholarBank - for publications and theses
NIE, NTU, NUS use DSpace as the platform for their IRs
- 2010 : SMU InK – using Digital Commons
- 2021 : SIT IRR for papers (Figshare)



Objectives of SMU InK

- To create visibility and raise the profile of SMU research and scholarly assets
- To provide organisation of the records of SMU research and scholarly assets
- To provide access to the full text where possible of SMU research and scholarly assets

Repositori Institusi

- Tujuan dari SMU InK adalah untuk meningkatkan profil, menyediakan organisasi record full text dari riset SMU dan aset ilmiahnya.




Setting up an IR

- Align the IR with vision / goals / policies at your institution
Menyamakan misi, tujuan dan kebijakan repositori institusi dengan institusi
- Get buy in from the key stakeholders
Mendapatkan dukungan penuh dari manajemen
- Sell the benefits to the stakeholders and the institution
Menjelaskan keuntungan dari repositori institusi
- Propose to set up a repository Mengajukan proposal
- Secure the budget and resources Mengajukan anggaran dan sumber daya

NUS, NTU, & SMU IRs are linked to the current research information system and this allows regular uploading of records and full text to the IRs

Open Science & Open Data

- Funders starting to ask for data to be shared / deposited
- Journal publishers starting to ask for data availability
- Some subject disciplines share data
- Some research results cannot be replicated
- Opportunity for libraries to support these needs

- NIE IR has the manuscripts of Dr Muhammad Ariff Ahmad.

This report provides a deeper understanding of the food insecurity situation in Singapore. Food insecurity refers to the lack of physical and/or economic access to sufficient, safe and nutritious food. The report sheds light on those experiencing food insecurity and the factors affecting this experience. In addition, it identifies gaps in food support provision and makes recommendations on how these gaps might be filled for a smoother and targeted food support distribution system.




