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



#### Insights


- 1. 3 of 4 writers have tried ChatGPT (for writing, in some ways)
- 2. All is expected to boost creativity
- 3. Mixed attitudes on influence of Al
- 4. Preference for human editors
- On being replaced: Copywriters at risk, but creative writing for entertainment, maybe less so

### 3. CURRENT EVENT: WRITERS' STRIKE



 Over 11,00 screenwriters who are members of the Writers Guild of America (WGA) have been on a strike which began since 2 May 2023







#### **Al-content not Literary Material?**

The WGA has drawn a line in the sand around minimum staffing and minimum weeks. Those issues will have to be addressed but there may be all kinds of creative ways to get there. AI — if I had to guess now, it will be some kind of statement giving WGA the cover it seeks — AI-produced content cannot be considered "literary material," which is an important designation in the WGA contract.






#### **Sudo Write**

Tools like "describe" generates a description of a character for the writer user

marketing copy, Sudowrite is designed for fiction writers. Authors paste what they've written into a soothing sunset-colored interface, select some words, and have the AI rewrite them in an ominous tone, or with more inner conflict, or propose a plot twist, or generate descriptions in every sense plus metaphor.

#### **Sudo Write**

- One specialised fiction-writing AI tool is Sudowrite
  - built on OpenAI's language model GPT-3
  - where most of these tools are meant to write company emails and marketing copy,
     Sudowrite is designed for fiction writers
  - Authors paste what they've written, select some words and certain writer tasks can seemingly be performed:
    - -Al rewrite them in an ominous tone, or with more inner conflict
    - -propose a plot twist
    - -generate descriptions in every sense plus metaphor



#### Spoiler Alert

- "over half of all the novels and Stories
   published in the English language" are now
   created by Adolph Knipe on the Great Automatic
   Grammatizator.
- Successful writers have their names (and styles) bought over, and AI writes in their style



#### **Volume of Al-generated Works Will Increase**

- The corpus of work generated by AI will likely gain traction over time
- What begins as a niche genre (AI-fiction) may become the norm



#### **Classification / Genre**

Future works *largely* produced by AI may be <u>categorised</u> as AI generated works

- When you enter an art gallery, you do not see photos
- At a photography exhibition you do not see art
- They are different genres / mediums



#### **Authorship, Credits and Royalties**

**Scenario 1:** Al Works may be credited and differentiated in some way from human work

Some possible ways to credit AI works:

- Al-fiction edited by (prompter)
- Al-fiction in the style of (training data writer names), edited by (prompter)
  - -It could be similar to creative commons, derivative works
  - -Writers whose works are used to train AI could be paid royalties



#### **Audience Attitudes**

#### This is hard to predict now

- Will consumers simply lap up whatever is cooked up by AI as long as it is entertaining?
  - -like instant noodles over hand-made noodles?



#### **Normalisation**

**Scenario 2:** It is also possible that **AI-generated fiction simply becomes accepted** with little distinction from human-written content.

For instance, we may not vigorously distinguish digital paintings over traditional paintings. Digital art is quite the norm.

In this scenario, classification and meta-tags do not label and distinguish most aigenerated fiction and works, as they become normalised

# 6. INNOVATION & TECHNOLOGY



#### It continues to appear that

#### there is a humanistic value in knowing that a human wrote those stories

- For instance, people are not interested in watching a chess match between two supercomputers, but there is a demand for watching human grandmasters
  - The same extends for many human type activities

What's humanistic value?

In this presentation, I'm defining humanistic value as follows:

"A thing has humanistic value if we can go "That's amazing" if and because it was done by a human"

#### **Summary**

- 1. Authors interviewed identify AI as a tool to boost creativity.
- 2. Authors believe much copywriting will be done by AI, but creative writing for entertainment may be less affected.
- 3. Strike by Writers Guild of America argues that AI-generated material cannot be "literary material" or "source material" and materials in MBA cannot be used to train AI.
- 4. Presenter opinion: ChatGPT 3 can generate short stories, story outline, mimic writing voices with some competency, but not yet able to do complex storytelling tasks (novels, worldbuilding).
- 5. Introduced one specialised fiction writing AI tool.
- 6. Discussed two possibilities where AI-generated fiction categorisation / crediting or widespread normalisation makes crediting of AI-generated work 'unnecessary'.
- 7. As technology advances, Libraries grows alongside these developments with partners and stakeholders to deliver value.
