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## Logic, Doxastic

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Doxastic logic, beginning with Hintikka's Knowledge and Belief. An Introduction to the Logic of the Two Notions (1962. Cornell University Press), studies relations between propositions about what we believe. Using 'a' as a proper name like 'Ann', ' $\rightarrow$ ' for 'if' as opposed to material implication, propositional variables such as 'p', 'q' and 'B' to represent the two-place relation, '... believes that ...'.

Ann believes that it is raining.

Bap.

Uncontroversial is,

 $Ba(p \& q) \rightarrow (Bap \& Baq).$ 

Controversial, even for ideally rational believers, are so-called 'BB' principles:

 $Bap \rightarrow BaBap$ 

and conversely.
